

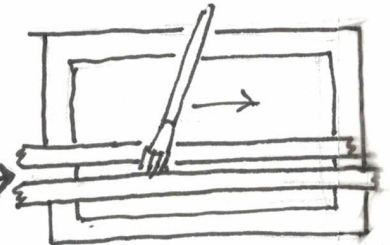
IDEAS FOR PAINTING WATER

1. Paint it, like Winslow.

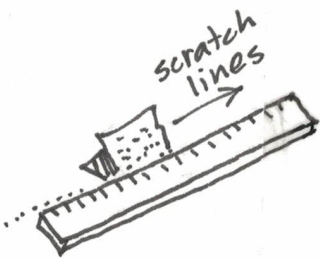


2. Lay clear wrap over a wet wash (hold tight horizontal wrinkles).

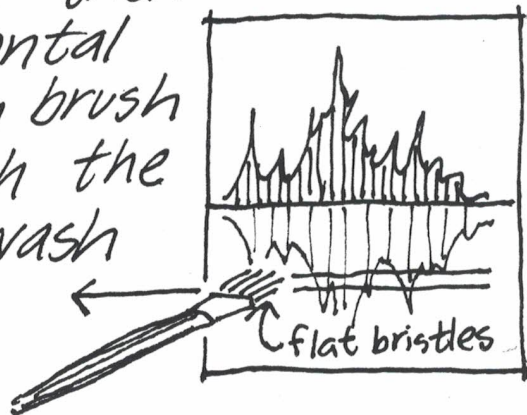
3. Tape across a dried wash and lift lines between gap in tape.



4. Run a folded sandpaper along edge of a ruler.

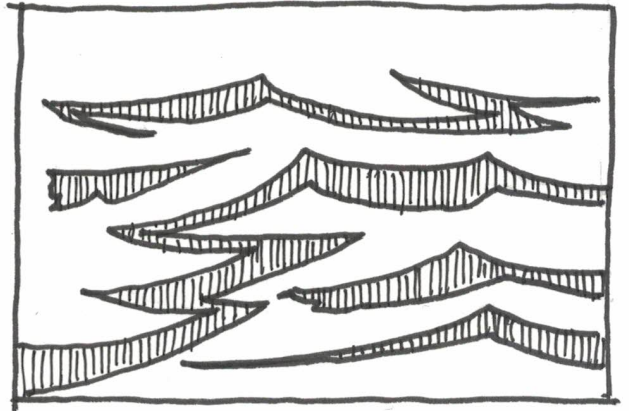


5. Paint reflections downward into wet wash, then draw horizontal thirsty brush through the wet wash



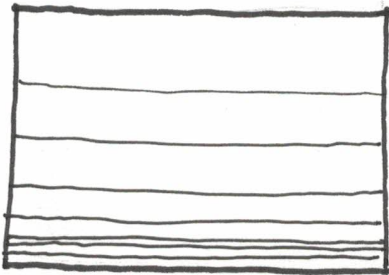
WATER IDEAS

A. Study these wave marks and practice with a flat brush held horizontally →

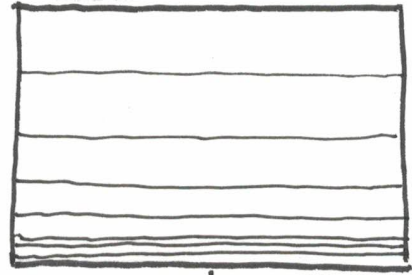


B. While your wave marks are still wet, soften the bottom edges.

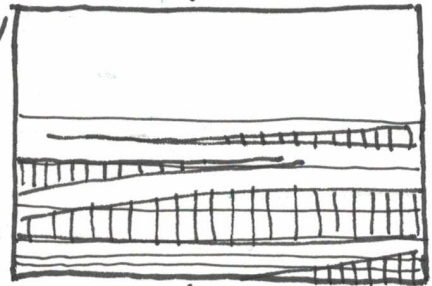
C. Try two different approaches:



Begin with a graded wash with the darkest value at the bottom, which is the foreground.



For this one, add some darker horizontal streaks while your wash is still wet, to create gentle rolling swells →



Add wave marks to your paper when it's dry. Soften the bottom edges. Largest waves will be at the bottom.
